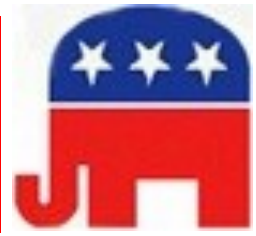

CAMPAIGN HOURS By Nickie Diersen, Achievements Chair

Now that our serious campaign work and holidays are behind us, it's time for the Southern Hills Republican Women to take credit for all the hard volunteer work that we have done over the last year or so. The National Federation of Republican Women has a Campaign Award Program that recognizes all of the clubs across the U.S. for the tremendous amounts of time volunteering (non-paid) for our Republican Party, our Republican candidates, and our Federation of Republican Women.

At our next meeting, I will have a print out of the hours I have received, either from you directly or on your behalf, and I ask you to verify the accuracy of the hours listed. The types of hours that are recognized for this award are Non-paid hours working for the Republican Party, our Republican candidates, and the National Federation of Republican Women for the period 7/1/09 – 6/30/11.

Specifically included are the following: Campaign hours spent at home (mailings, posters, calls, computer work); Work at/or for a campaign event (NOT if you attend as a paid guest); Attendance at State or National Federation Board of Directors Meetings and Conventions (including travel and including time spent in preparation for Federation meetings if you serve on a committee); Time in session at municipality, precinct/ward, county, district, state party conventions, or RNC conventions (including travel); Time spent as a county, state, or national party committee member or as a temporary member, i.e. Rules Committee, Resolutions Committee, etc.; Campaign work at club meetings, i.e. getting petitions signed, doing mailings, etc. (NOT TIME SPENT attending regular club meetings); Volunteering at any municipality, county, state or Federation headquarters; Volunteering for a Republican candidate for a non-partisan office, e.g. school board elections; Working as a poll watcher on Election Day (NOT if you are paid); Involvement in a Campaign Management School, i.e. training to be a faculty member, teaching and organizing a campaign school, etc.; Working on Election Day as an Election Judge or Election Clerk (only if you turn the money you are paid over to your county party or your local FRW club); Presenting campaign programs or speeches at local civic organizations; and Appearing on local media for the GOP cause; Time spent registering voters. This is an award given for "Political Campaign" time. It does NOT include time for charitable, civic, or anything other than volunteer time given as detailed above.

DID YOU KNOW? by Sydney Ingram Tomb of the Unknown Soldier



The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier refers to a grave in which the unidentifiable remains of a soldier are interred. The idea was first conceived by Walt Whitman during his first hand experience in the American Civil War. He penned the words **“the Bravest Soldier crumbles in mother earth, unburied and unknown.”**

The tomb typically contains the remains of a dead soldier who is unidentified and **“unknown but to God”** who serves as a symbol for all of the unknown dead wherever they fell. The United States honors these fallen heroes with The Tomb of the Unknowns, Arlington National Cemetery, Virginia. These Americans not only gave their lives but their identities for our freedom and our way of life. This tomb contains the remains of unidentified American soldiers from WWI, WWII and the Korean War. An unknown soldier from the Vietnam War was originally buried at the site, but this soldier was subsequently identified and removed. The advances in technology, specifically DNA testing, make it unlikely that other US soldiers will be buried at the site.

Interesting Facts:

- Normally three teams of Guards rotate on 24 hour shifts. In addition to Physical Training and grooming, the average Guard spends 8 hours prepping his/her uniform for the next work day.
- The Guard takes 21 steps across the Tomb of the Unknowns, alluding to the twenty-one gun salute.
- The Guard’s movements consist of a combination of 21 steps/21 seconds repeated over and over until the Guard Change.
- No matter the weather, the Guards stand their watch—they call it “walking the mat.” They never allow any feeling of cold or heat be seen by anyone. However the welfare of the soldier is never put at risk.
- Guards have contingencies that are ready to be executed if necessary.
- The Guard is changed every thirty minutes in the summer and every hour during the winter. The Tomb is guarded 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. In fact, there has been a Guard on duty in front of the Tomb every minute of every day since 1937. The Guards do not change the way they guard the Tomb, even at night when no one is around. The Guards do this because they feel that the Unknown Soldiers who are buried in the Tomb deserve the very best they have to give. There have only been 3 female Guards.

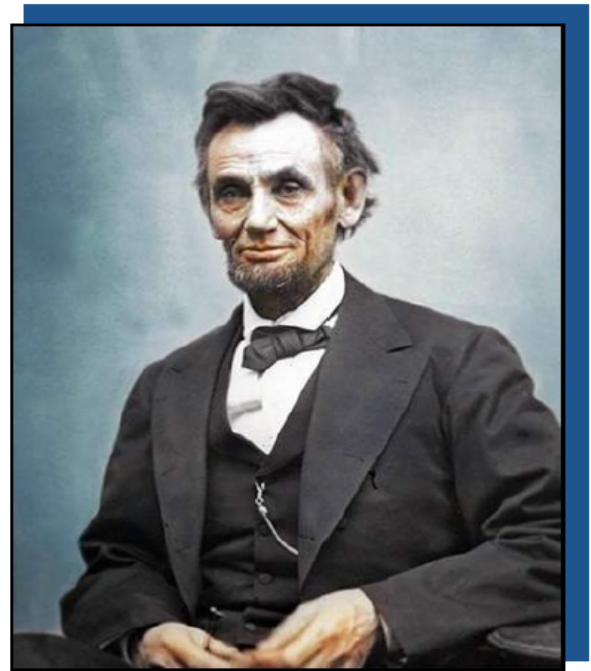
