BALANCED BUDGET AMENDMENT Part of the agreement between the GOP, the Dems and the President over raising the debt limit was that there would be a vote in Congress in November on a Balanced Budget Amendment to the U.S. Constitution. That vote is right around the corner. Here is what you can do to help this amendment pass.

TAKE ACTION:

1. Visit GOP.GOV for more information about the amendment.
2. Send letters and make phone calls to your Representatives and Senators asking them to vote for the balanced budget amendment.
3. Call your friends and family and encourage them to do the same.
4. E-mail your contacts and post on FACEBOOK asking for support.
5. Persist until we have this Constitutional Amendment ratified.
6. This is not a new idea. 49 states have some kind a balanced budget requirement. In 1995, the House passed this amendment and it failed by one vote in the Senate. After the amendment passes both houses it goes directly to the states for ratification. **THE PRESIDENT CANNOT VETO THIS AMENDMENT.**

THE NEW REDISTRICTING MAPS ARE SET, MAYBE By: Virginia Finnegan

If the Republicans don't appeal, the new redistricting maps are set and there are some interesting changes for our members. As I read these almost final maps, here is what I see.

US CONGRESS: CD 3, Congressman Joe Heck's district, used to have a three prong pinwheel look, taking in two areas on the east side of the valley and one area on the west, cutting Sun City Anthem into two parts with one third in CD 3 and the two thirds in CD 2, Congressman Amodei's district. The new map consolidates CD 3 across the bottom of the state, including all of Sun City Anthem and the surrounding communities. Statistically this district will have a larger concentration of registered Democrats which will make Congressman Heck's re-election a challenge.

STATE SENATE: State Senate District 5, State Senator Michael Roberson's district, whose southern most boundary used to be at the Henderson city limits will now extend to the edge of Sun City Anthem and our members living north of Sun City Anthem will now be included in his district. State Senate District 12, State Senator Joe Hardy's district, will still include all of Sun City Anthem as well as Boulder City and outlying areas.

STATE ASSEMBLY: The boundary for State Assembly District 22, Assemblyman Lynn Stewart's district, has been moved north and will no longer include Sun City Anthem but will include some developments to the north of SCA that are east of Eastern Avenue. Sun City Anthem will be in District 23, Assemblywoman Melissa Woodbury's district, a Republican, and our members living in the Seven Hills Area will be in District 41, a seat now held by Assemblyman Paul Aizley, a Democrat.

Senator Michael Roberson will be our speaker in January and he will have details of how these changes in the State Legislative districts will impact the 2013 legislative session.

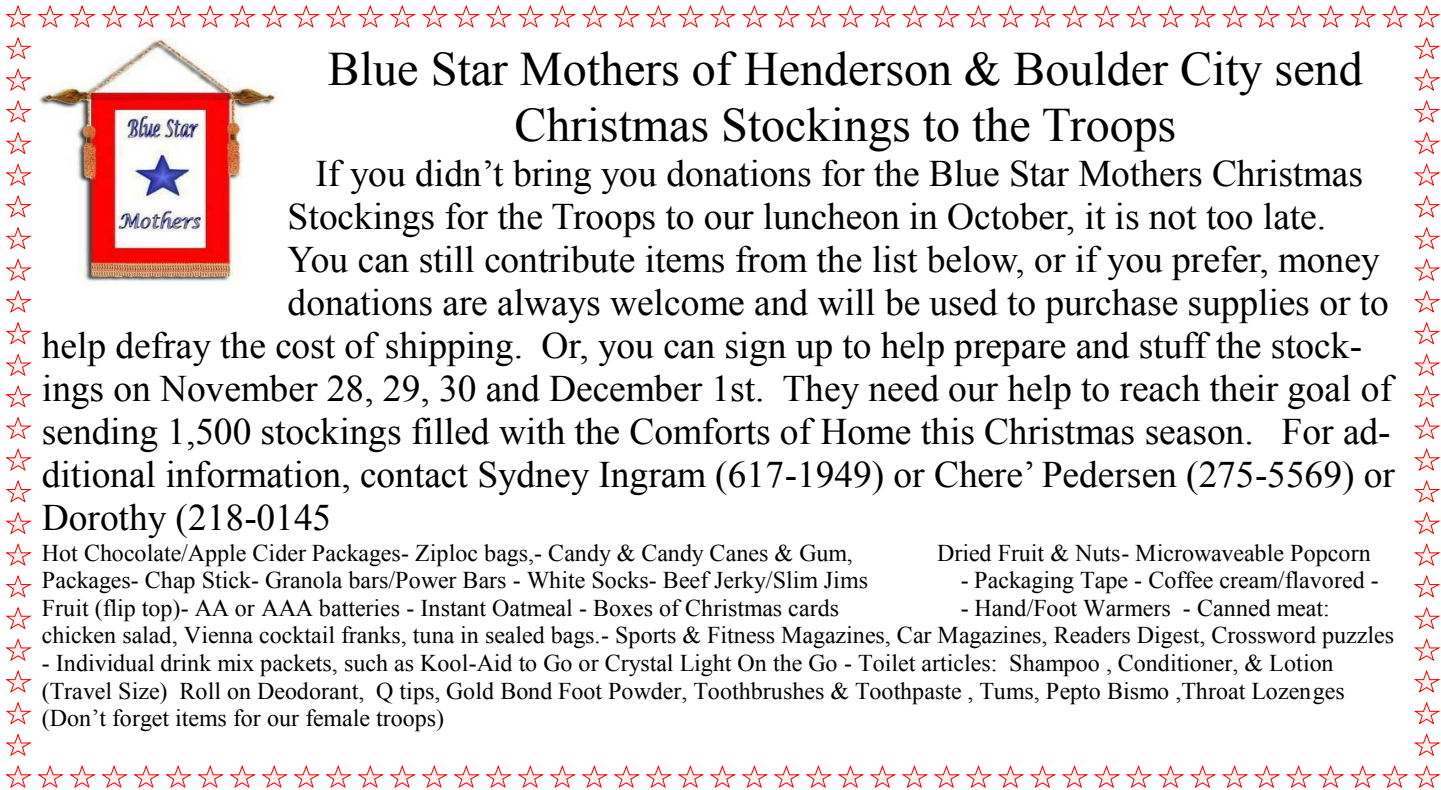
Here are the results of the Presidential Straw Poll taken at our October 25th luncheon.

Blue Star Mothers of Henderson & Boulder City send Christmas Stockings to the Troops

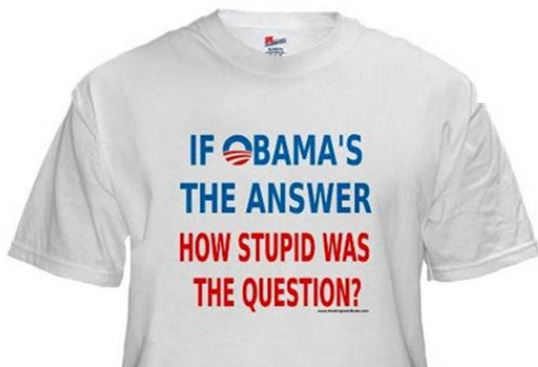

NEVADA CAUCUS DATE SET After much ado, the Republican caucus has been finalized for Saturday February 4, 2012. In order to better understand the caucus process in the State of Nevada I recently attended a Clark County Republican Party Caucus Training session. It was informative but still left this native of a primary state somewhat confused.

That being said, a caucus allows a voter to influence people in their precinct and vote for your Republican Presidential Candidate. This is the beginning of the process that then leads to the National Republican Convention and eventually to the person chosen to represent the Republican party in the national election for President of the United States of America and will be up against our current President, Barack Obama.

With Nevada being one of the five early bell weather states and the only Western state, the Nevada Caucus should get lots of national media attention. Candidates are equally interested in participating because the winners retain their delegates as established with proportional representation. So how do we make this very public event run smoothly? Your help is greatly needed in working the caucus, participating in your precinct meeting and voting.

Caucuses bring people together by precincts; "the precinct is the building block of politics". Given the number of precincts in the area, the CCRP anticipates needing about 600 volunteers! The CCRP currently has about 700 members on the county central committee. So, you can see that your participation will make the difference. If you aren't a member of the CCRP, please consider joining. Meetings are at the Silverton at 6 PM on the third Tuesday every other month; the next meeting is Tuesday, November 15th. Your membership will give our Nevada Federation a stronger voice in the political process (EDITOR'S NOTE: Check the caucus web site for up to date information on the caucus and for a link to check your registration status www.ccrp2012caucus.org.)

REPUBLICAN DEBATE On Tuesday October 18, CNN sponsored the first and only Republican Presidential candidate debate scheduled in Nevada. The event garnered a great deal of media attention but more important it gave the voters and the nation yet another view of the candidates. The event was held at the Sands Convention Center at the Venetian and several local celebrities were noted in the audience along with some of the SHRW members. It was exciting to be among those who witnessed this event. The candidates debating were Michele Bachman, Newt Gingrich, Ron Paul, Rick Perry, Mitt Romney, Herman Cain, and Rick Santorum.

The candidates had a contentious few exchanges and the media were mixed on who was the eventual winner of this debate. The people of Nevada were the winners overall as the debate along with the three day Western Republican Leadership Conference drew attendees and attention to the state of Nevada. Bringing the spotlight to Nevada and all it has to offer is never a bad thing.

CANDIDATE SPEAKS IN ANTHEM Presidential candidate Herman Cain spoke to local residents on Wednesday October 19 after having been at the CNN debate the previous night. The room was packed early and the numbers were impressive. It appeared from polling that not just Republicans but also some Democrats as well as Independents were represented in the room. It appears there is a great deal of interest in this upcoming Presidential election from all segments of the community. A well educated electorate presents a positive outcome. Mr. Cain spoke at length about his platform and took several questions from the audience. The event was sponsored by the newly formed Anthem Republican Club. It was exciting to be a part of the political process and have a candidate right in our own backyard.

DID YOU KNOW? by Sydney S. Ingram

Thousands of American women served valiantly overseas during WWII, many sacrificing their lives. The most vulnerable were the nurses who served on or near the front lines. One in particular stands out—1st.Lt. Mary Roberts Wilson who was the first—but not the last—woman to receive the Silver Star for her efforts at the Battle of Anzio during the Italian campaign of 1944. She and her team of three nurses set up medical tents at Anzio. When heavy combat began the nurses were given the option to evacuate. They declined. Despite German shrapnel ripping thru the surgical tent, they kept on working. 1st. Roberts and her team all received the Silver Stars. One of the nurses- 2nd Lt. Ellen Ainsworth received the medal posthumously as she was killed during the Anzio battle. Lt. Roberts and her team continued their jobs for 2-1/2 years, treating more than 70,000 patients during that time. (For more information see VFW magazine 2009.)

WW2 cannot be left behind without acknowledging the contributions of two other groups of women serving at home. The first are the women who left their homes to serve in many capacities, particularly in the factories. In order to encourage women to do their patriotic duty and enter the workforce, the icon "Rosie the Riveter" was created. She inspired a social movement that increased the number of working women to over 20 million by 1944, a 57% increase from 1940. Rosie helped to unify the experiences of these women as they proved to themselves and the country that they could do a "man's job." While most of these women were expected to return to the traditional roles of wives and mothers, the changes brought by the war provided the foundation for the contemporary woman's movement.



Another group of women that served heroically were the "pinup" girls. For the men serving far from their families, the soldiers' morale was strengthened by the persuasive power of these "pinup" girls. Betty Grable became the most famous of these pinups. In addition, she and most of the stars of that era willingly performed for the troops, many times in makeshift bunkers as they were being blitzed by bombs from Nazi planes. The 11th Commandment; can we rise to the challenge? The recent redistricting has brought all of Anthem into one Congressional District, the 3rd, and their Representative is Congressman Joe Heck. Many women and men of SHRW have volunteered their time and energy to help Joe in 2010, yet sadly they could not vote for him. While the district still has 3 % more Democrats than Republicans, Joe was able to win this seat when it had 8% Democratic margin by appealing to all voters with his common sense approach and positive vision for the future of our country.

Joe has been recognized many times since he was elected as one of the best freshman legislators to grace the halls of Congress. Like his old State Senate days, one aspect in particular hasn't changed; he still reads, investigates and discusses the bills and their contents thoroughly before voting on it, as well as opening it up for input from his constituents. These requirements are non- negotiable and applicable to every bill, every day. Not one bill escapes his scrutiny

Voting on bills may seem like it's just a push of a button, but it is so much more. With every vote, there will be people voicing an opposition while others may show strong support. If you would like an explanation on a particular vote, call or email Joe at his district office to have your questions and concerns addressed. It is important to remember that what is presented in the chambers and what is reported in the media are usually two different things, with Republicans usually on the downward end. Once people get an explanation, only then does it make sense.

It is vitally important that we remain united and keep the focus on our goal; to replace Obama and get our country back in working order. This is not the time to 'make a statement' or fracture. We risk losing the opportunity to win the majority in the Senate, keep the majority in Congress and change the White House. Otherwise, it's Obamacare, Stimulus IV and counting, and a record increase in taxes upwards of 44% that we will assume in our golden years, and leave to our children and grandchildren.

President Ronald Reagan set a high standard on how to conduct ourselves as a party. Remember his 11th Commandment, "*Thou shalt not speak ill of any fellow Republican.*". That was a valuable piece of advice, one we all should make a better effort to live by. Democrats tend to show a more united effort and respect for their elected officials. They have a tendency to stay with the 'program' without promoting any negative comments on Face book, Twitter, etc. We all must present a strong positive attitude for every Republican candidate and elected official as well as our party to succeed in the upcoming elections. COMMENTS FROM ASSEMBLYMAN LYNN STEWART

I was elected to the Assembly in 2006, and have worked to promote conservative causes and represent District 22 in the State Legislature. In addition, I am activity involved in the community and participate in a variety of programs including: Catholic Charities Senior Services Committee, Kids Vention, Bring a Vet to School Day, and Citizens for Responsible Government. Because of my commitment to recruiting candidates, raising funds for the caucus, and supporting the caucus in the assembly, I have held the position of assistant minority floor leader since November of 2008.

During the 2011 legislative session, I worked hard to promote conservative fiscal values while addressing serious budget issues. I supported Governor Sandoval's budget and voted to reduce the state budget by 3% for the biennium. The proposed tax increases by the Democrats would have placed a \$1.2 billion tax increase on Nevadans. Assembly Republicans instead pushed for reforms, not tax increases to balance the state budget.

Due to my position on the Taxation committee, I was able to oppose tax increases early in the session. Several of the tax increases that I opposed, and which never made it out of the Committee, include: 2% sales and services tax, 9% alcohol tax, 9% tobacco tax, and 4.5% tax increase on businesses. I also supported the elimination of the Modified Business Tax (MBT) which will no longer apply to 70% of Nevada business. This equates to 115,281 small businesses in Nevada that will experience tax relief because of our efforts.

I introduced eleven bills, spanning issues from transportation and healthcare to protecting the rights of our military. AB 420, which I sponsored, was passed into law and revised the rights of members of the Nevada National Guard. It expanded employment protection for them during training, duty, and meetings. It prohibited the serving of a summons for a civil action or administrative proceeding against a guardsman when he is absent due National Guard duties. It also postpones these proceedings against the member during that same period. A preference in hiring of guard members was also created by this bill for certain public employment positions.

While not passed by the Legislature, I introduced bills that would have required photo ID order to vote , restricted demonstrations at military funerals, and established English as the official State language. I also sponsored AB 369, which would have enacted the Freedom of Choice in Health Care Act. The intent of this act was to stop the implementation of Obama Care in Nevada. I continues to search for ways to reduce spending, lower taxes, and put Nevadans back to work.
